## **Will Rogers: Oklahoma's Favorite Son**

Will Rogers (1879—1935) was one of the most beloved entertainers of the early 1900's. He was a Cherokee-American humorist who starred in the Ziegfeld Follies and motion pictures, and kept Americans laughing with frequent radio programs and newspaper columns.

He said, "I don't make jokes. I just watch the government and report the facts." Learn about the life and legacy of Will Rogers in this presentation that features some of his famous reflections.
